A. Sp\_\_\_\_\_ – "let him that speaks in a tongue"

**B.** Su\_\_\_\_\_ – "For if I pray in a tongue"

C. Si\_\_\_\_\_\_ - "I will sing with the spirit"

II. Priority - "Yet in the church I had rather" (vs. 16-20)

 ${\it Prioritizing:}$ 

A. T\_\_\_\_\_\_ - "say Amen at thy giving of thanks"

**B.** T\_\_\_\_\_\_ — "that I might teach others also"

III. Purpose — "not to them who believe" (vs. 21-22)

Different gifts for the:

**A.** S\_\_\_\_\_\_\_ - "yet for all that they will not hear me"

**B.** S\_\_\_\_\_\_ – "tongues are a sign...to them that believe not"

C. S\_\_\_\_\_\_ – "but prophesying...for them that believe"
